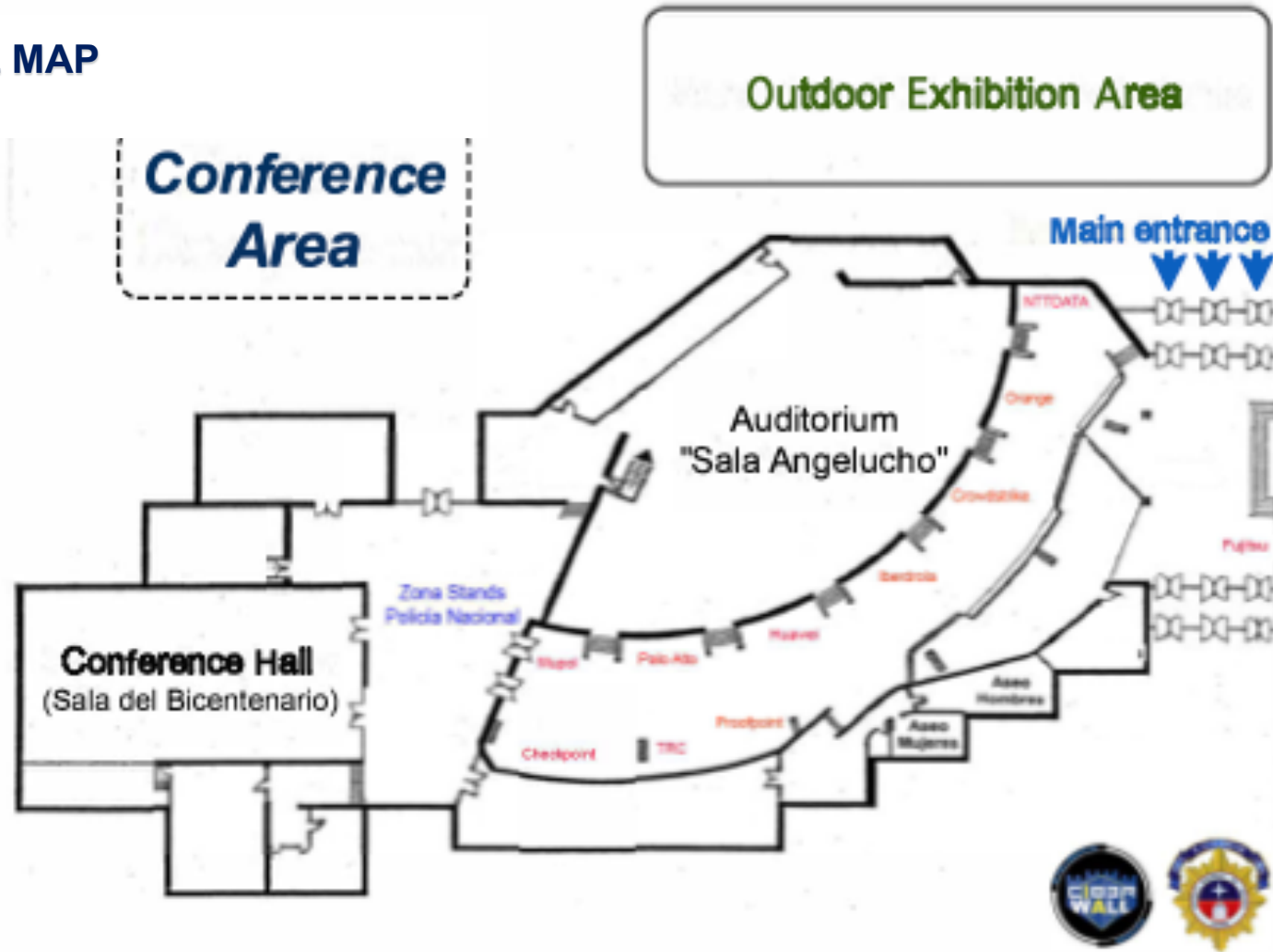

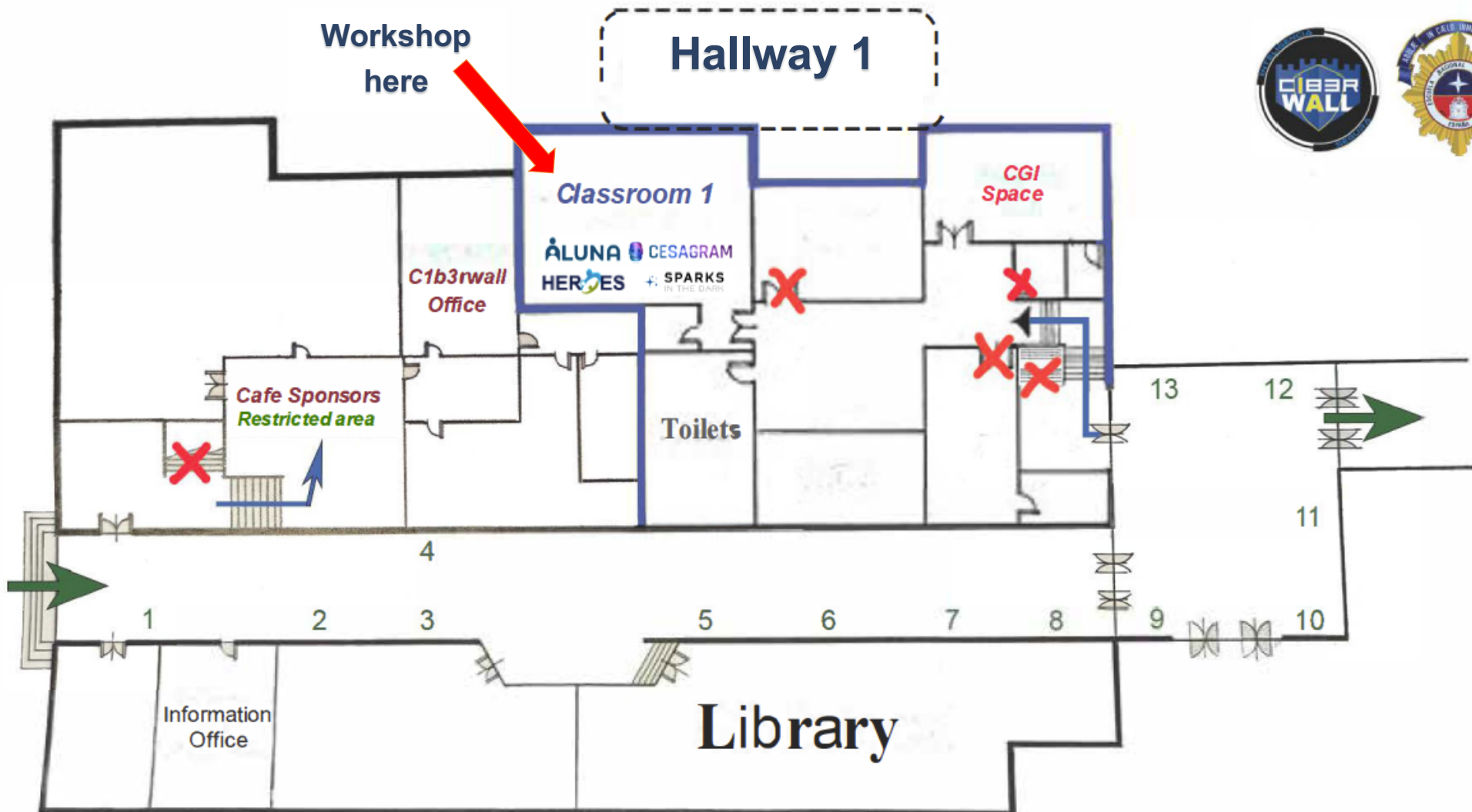

CIB3RWALL MAP



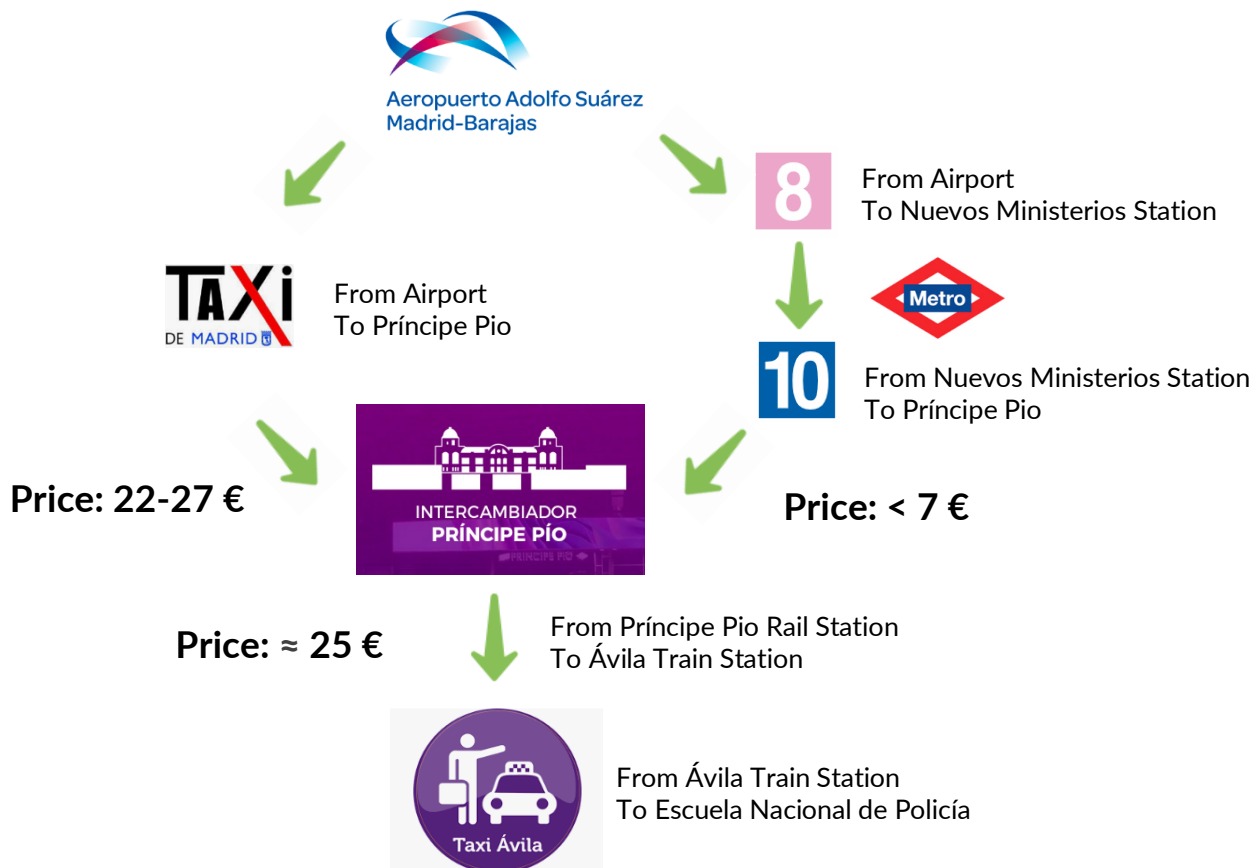


Practical Information

How to reach the Spanish National Police Academy

It can take around 3 hours from the Adolfo Suárez-Madrid Barajas Airport to Ávila by train:

- **1a. Metro:** Airport – Nuevos Ministerios (Line 8), Nuevos Ministerios – Príncipe Pío (Line 10) (≈7€)
- **1b. Taxi:** Airport – Príncipe Pío (22-27€)
- **2. Train:** Príncipe Pío – Ávila (≈25€)



Price for a taxi trip from Barajas Airport to Ávila will be more ≈ 150€

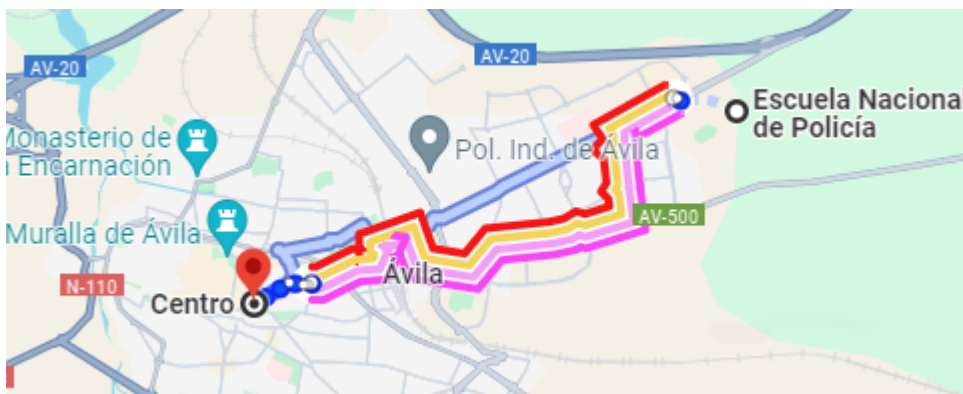

Moving Around the City



From the Escuela Nacional de Policía to the City Center is around 40 minutes walk. But you can take the **Bus – Line 1, 3, 4, 5 or 6** and be in the City Center in around 15 minutes

Walk along the historic Walls of Avila

The Walls of Avila is one of the best-preserved medieval fortifications in Europe. The 2.5 Km stretch of the impressive stone wall encloses the historic old town of the city. There are about 88 semi-circular defensive towers on the 2.5 km long stretch of the wall. Both the Christian and Mudejar artists took part in the construction.



Visit Ávila Cathedral

Avila Cathedral is one of the oldest Gothic cathedrals in Spain. The fortress like cathedral was constructed in the 12th century. It's dedicated to Saint Salvador. The apse of this cathedral is one of the turrets on the city wall. This gives the cathedral a fortress like shape. Inside the cathedral, you would find an eclectic blend of Romanesque and Gothic styles. There are some lovely stained glass windows. Entrance fee to the cathedral is 6 Euros per adult.



Enjoy the Avila Gastronomy

Taste the local cuisine of Avila, including its famous T-bone steak, Judias del Barco (local beans), and Yemas de Santa Teresa (sweet egg yolk pastries).
